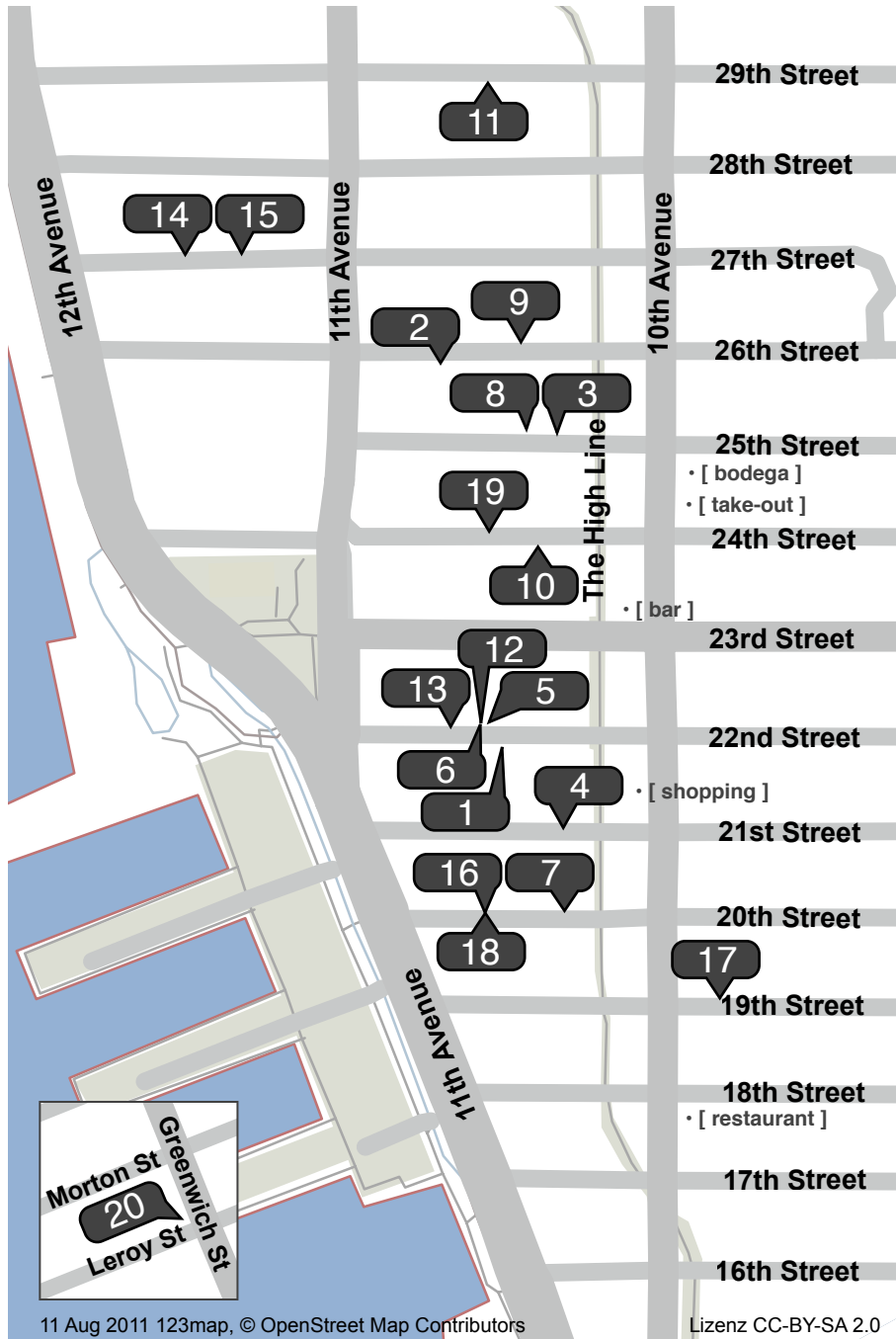


The Gallerina Guide to Chelsea Openings

[1] Carolina Nitsch Project Room Son-of-a-diplomat Rikrit Tiravanija creates an 84-foot wrap-around-the-room scroll inspired by his passport. • 534 W 22nd St • Through 10/22

[2] Lehmann Maupin Do Ho Suh's crazy-obsessive replicas of homes he has lived in — sliced, diced, crashed and exploded. • 540 W 26th St • Through 10/22

[3] Nancy Margolis Gouaches about urban decay made on urban decay ("found paper") by Maysey Craddock. Meta. • 523 W 25th St • Through 10/15

[4] Tanya Bonakdar Tidy arrangements of the odd and bizarre by Haim Steinbach. Bonus points: Show invite featured "Creature from the Black Lagoon." • 521 W 21st St • Through 10/22

[5] Morgan Lehman A gathering of vintage-y photographs acquired in flea markets, as organized by collector Peter Cohen. Intriguing... • 535 W 22nd St • Through 10/15

[6] Yancey Richardson Hot rugby players with injuries sit for formal photographic portraits by Amy Elkins. Oh, grrrr. • 535 W 22nd St • Through 10/22

[7] Jack Shainman Nick Cave's ongoing soundsuit project: crazy costumes that rattle under piles of beads and buttons. Always a trip. • 513 W 20th St • Through 10/8

[8] Yossi Milo Pieter Hugo, the photographer known for depicting Nigeria's hyena men is now chronicling the recyclers of our toxic digital waste. • 525 W 25th St • Through 10/29

[9] Schroeder Romero & Shredder Photorealist painter Jordan Bunch recreates images of 19th century women diagnosed with hysteria. Creepy voyeur factor: Sky high. • 531 W 26th St • Through 10/8

[10] C24 A group show that's all about artists who aren't from the Bermuda Art Triangle of NY, London or Berlin. (More like Istanbul and New Orleans.) Bring it! • 514 W. 24th St • Through 10/22

[11] Sean Kelly Installations by Leandro Erlich that take the elevator as inspiration. Includes a 50' sideways shaft you can walk through. So "Die Hard!" • 528 W 29th St • Through 10/22

[12] PPOW Saucy feminist-conceptualist Martha Wilson takes on aging and the body in video and photography. Expect cerebral absurdist fun. • 535 W 22nd St • Through 10/8

[13] Friedrich Petzel The surreal-bizarre paintings of Nicola Tyson, an artist who strips the human form down to its distorted, sinewy innards. • 537 W 22nd St • Until 11/5

[14] Winkleman Cheeky data-driven pieces by Jennifer Dalton chronicle the lack of ladies on cultural and political programs. I am woman hear me RAWR! • 621 W 27th St • Through 10/15

[15] Derek Eller Hulk, smash! Or in the case of this install, it's artist Adam Marnie putting his fists into pieces of sheetrock. So aggro. • 615 W 27th St • Through 10/8

[16] Bitforms Must-see for the tech nerds: Works by Manfred Mohr, the pioneer digital artist, who was using computers before Cory Arcangel was born. • 529 W 20th St, 2nd Fl • Through 10/15

[17] Postmasters Works by Anthony Goicolea, known for his manipulated naturescapes and copious pictures of himself. Moody!! • 459 W 19th St • Through 10/15

[18] Jonathan LeVine Hand-made figurines by Michael Levitt that lampoon art world VIPs. I will DIE if no one gives me the Matthew Barney doll with the weird penis-thing. • 529 W 20th St, 9th Fl • Thru 10/8

[19] Luhning Augustine Painter Johannes Kahrs creates stylized works out of bits of images he finds in various media. Plus: gallery generally good for scene-y scene. • 531 W 24th St • Through 10/22

[20] Gavin Brown's Enterprise This place is all about the SCENE. Season starts with pop portraitist Alex Katz. Should be easy to look disaffected. • 620 Greenwich St • Through 10/8

[bar] The Half King Long menu of drafts and bottles, as well as tuna-quinoa burgers. • 505 W 23rd St

[restaurant] Star on 18 Diner Get loaded at The Half King, then come here for disco fries. • 128 10th Ave

[take-out] Bottino Take-Out Fresh-roasted pork loins, bresaola, fresh mozzarella & more. Perfect for picnicking. Open 'til 8pm. • 246 10th Ave

[bodega] London Terrace Grocery An only-in-NYC bodega stocked with tall boys, rolling papers and L'Uomo Vogue. • 250 10th Ave

[shopping] Printed Matter Sundry art one-offs, including art prints, art cassettes, art zines and art toilet paper. Handy. • 195 10th Ave
